


Wheat Aleph

Grape Aleph



In Science we have been learning about Healthy Eating and have tried different dried fruit like mango and goji berries and have added the ones we liked into our grains mix to make delicious energy balls. For History we've had a visitor come in and give a display of what life was like in the 15th century, where we were able to investigate the food, clothes and hygiene of the time and have a go at churning butter and pulling an archery bow.

Pomegranate Aleph




looked at nutritional facts on the back of some of our favourite snacks and talked about how humans can maintain a balanced diet.


